WHY SHOULD I VOTE?

-  The choices made by politicians directly affect our daily lives.
-  They make policy, pass laws and regulations, debate issues of national and international importance, and decide how income from taxes and rates is spent on public services.
-  Elections provide an opportunity to make your feelings known on the issues that matter to you.
-  By voting you can influence the decisions that will shape the Island's future.



REGISTERING TO VOTE

Taking part in elections is a fundamental democratic right. But remember – you must first be registered to vote.

The electoral register is a list of all the people entitled to vote in elections in the Isle of Man. It includes your name, address and an electoral number that is unique to you.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO REGISTER?

You are entitled to be on the electoral register if you have reached the age of 16, have had your usual place of abode in the Isle of Man for the preceding 12 months and are not subject to any legal incapacity to vote.

Special arrangements will be in place to enable Isle of Man residents who are serving in the Armed Forces, studying off-Island or temporarily working overseas to be registered and to vote in the 2021 House of Keys General Election.

HOW DO I ENSURE MY ENTRY IS CORRECT?

You are responsible for ensuring your electoral registration details are always kept up to date. For example, please let us know if you move home.

You can confirm your details or make any changes by responding to the enquiry form that is sent to each household at the beginning of the year. Online and postal options are available to make responding quick, easy and free of charge.
