MANX RALLY ROAD RACES AUTHORISATION 2026

Made: 28 April 2026
Coming into Operation: 6 May 2026

The Department of Infrastructure gives the following authorisation under sections 5 and 7 of the Road Races Act 2016.

1 Title

This Authorisation is the Manx Rally Road Races Authorisation 2026.

2 Grant of Authorisation

The Department of Infrastructure authorises Manx Auto Sport Ltd (in its capacity as organiser) to use the road or roads specified in Schedule 1 for the purposes of racing in accordance with the following conditions.

3 Interpretation

(1) In this Authorisation—

“**Act**” means the Road Races Act 2016;

“**closure period**” means a period within the days and times specified in Schedule 1, during which the race area or part of the race area is authorised for use for a race in accordance with paragraph 4;

“**competing vehicle**” means a motor car authorised to participate in the race;

“**emergency services vehicle**” means –

- (a) an ambulance, medical response vehicle, fire brigade vehicle, police vehicle or coastguard vehicle or trailer being used for an emergency purpose;
- (b) a motor vehicle or trailer being used for civil defence or bomb disposal purposes;

“**motor car**” and “**motor vehicle**” have the meaning given by section 65 of the Road Traffic Act 1985;

“pedestrian” includes –

- (c) a wheelchair user; and
- (d) a person using a mobility aid other than a bicycle or motor vehicle;

“prohibited area” means an area specified in Schedule 2 as being prohibited;

“race area” means the road or roads authorised to be used for a race specified in Schedule 1;

“restricted area” means an area specified in Schedule 2 as being restricted;

“senior police officer” means a member of the Isle of Man Constabulary –

- (a) of the rank of sergeant or above; and
- (b) authorised by the Chief Constable to act as senior police officer for the purposes of this Authorisation;

“side road” means any part of a road that leads onto and forms part of the race area provided that a side road is not a road over which a race may be held;

“signage” includes any barrier, tape, sign, markings or structure which indicates restricted or prohibited access to the race area, a side road, a prohibited area, a restricted area, a hazardous area, a diversion or closure; and

“vehicle” includes a motor cycle, motor car and pedal cycle.

- (2) Any approval (howsoever referred to) referred to in this Authorisation may be given subject to conditions with which the recipient must comply.

4 Authorisation for use of roads for races

- (1) The organiser is authorised to use the race area on the days and during the times specified in Schedule 1 and subject to complying with the conditions specified in this Authorisation.
- (2) The authorisation in sub-paragraph (1), is subject to notification from any emergency service that it would in its opinion be unsafe to close or use the roads in connection with a race.
- (3) Only a competing vehicle may participate in a race.
- (4) The organiser is to have in place, comply with and ensure compliance with such policies and procedures as it reasonably considers necessary in order to –
 - (a) ensure that the provisions of this Authorisation are communicated to, understood, administered and complied with by every person with a role or responsibility in connection with the race area, a race or otherwise under the terms of this Authorisation; and
 - (b) ensure, as far as reasonably practicable –
 - (i) that a race is carried out safely; and

- (ii) the safety of persons in connection with a race, including competitors, race officials, spectators and members of the public,

and copies of such policies and procedures must be provided to the Department not less than 6 months prior to the start of a race or such shorter period as the Department may specify.

- (5) In this Authorisation, where a person other than the organiser or the Department is to do or refrain from doing a thing, it is for the organiser to ensure that the provision is complied with.

5 Suspension of right of way on the race area

- (1) During any closure period —
 - (a) the right of way over any part of the race area is suspended and no traffic may enter or remain on it; and
 - (b) a person must not enter or remain, or cause or permit any vehicle or animal to enter or remain on any part of the race area.
- (2) This is subject to the exemptions in paragraphs 7 and 8.
- (3) For the avoidance of doubt, a closure period will be treated as in force for the purposes of this Authorisation when an announcement is made by the Clerk of the Course specifying that all roads on any particular race area are now closed.

6 Regulation of traffic on side roads

A person must not enter or remain, or cause or permit any vehicle or animal to enter or remain on a side road in contravention of any indication given by signage unless permitted to do so by —

- (a) a constable;
- (b) a marshal; or
- (c) the organiser.

This is subject to the exemptions in paragraphs 7 and 8.

7 Exemptions from paragraphs 5 and 6

- (1) Paragraphs 5 and 6 do not apply to —
 - (a) the Clerk of the Course;
 - (b) a person approved by the Clerk of the Course which may include —
 - (i) a constable, fire officer, medical or veterinary personnel, highway maintenance and recovery personnel;

- (ii) competitors taking part in the race in question and any person authorised by the organiser to assist those persons; and
 - (iii) media representatives, television crews and photographers approved by the organiser and bearing an official badge, armlet or tabard issued by the organiser.
- (2) Paragraphs 5 and 6 do not apply to a competing vehicle or to any vehicle approved by the Clerk of the Course.
- (3) Before approving a vehicle for the purpose of this paragraph, the Clerk of the Course must have regard to any procedure that appears to be relevant.

8 Temporary opening of the race area to traffic

- (1) This paragraph has effect despite anything in paragraphs 5, 6 and 7.
- (2) If a race is temporarily postponed or suspended or during any interval during a closure period, the Clerk of the Course may authorise traffic to cross or proceed along such part of the race area at such times and subject to complying with the directions of a constable or marshal, as the Clerk may specify.
- (3) Nothing in sub-paragraph (2) permits a vehicle to proceed in the reverse direction of the race, except with the authorisation of the Clerk of the Course.

9 Prohibited areas

- (1) The Clerk of the Course must ensure that —
 - (a) the extent of a prohibited area is clearly marked and indicated by signs bearing the words “Prohibited Area”; and
 - (b) so far as is reasonably practicable, no person contravenes sub-paragraph (2).
- (2) During a closure period, a person must not enter or remain, or cause or permit a vehicle to enter or remain in a prohibited area, except to go to the aid of a person or to prevent further danger or risk to a competitor or any other person.

10 Restricted areas

- (1) The Clerk of the Course must ensure that —
 - (a) the extent of a restricted area is clearly marked and indicated by signage including signs bearing the words “Restricted Area”; and
 - (b) so far as is reasonably practicable, no person contravenes sub-paragraph (2).

- (2) During a closure period, except in accordance with sub-paragraph (3), a person must not enter or remain, or cause or permit a vehicle to enter or remain in a restricted area.
- (3) Sub-paragraph (2) does not apply to –
 - (a) a race official, marshal or constable in the course of his or her duty; or
 - (b) a photographer, member of television crew or other person or vehicle approved by the Clerk of the Course.

11 Restrictions on speed during a closure period

- (1) Any motor vehicle, authorised by the Clerk of the Course to travel on the race area during a closure period, must not exceed a speed of 80mph.
- (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to competing vehicles, zero (safety) cars and emergency service vehicles.

12 Appointment of marshals

- (1) The organiser must appoint marshals in respect of any race to be held under this Authorisation.
- (2) In relation to the appointment of marshals, the organiser must comply with section 9 of the Act.
- (3) Without limiting sub-paragraph (2), the organiser must have in place and comply with a marshalling plan to ensure that a suitable and sufficient number of competent marshals are appointed and present at appropriate locations around the race area to enforce this Authorisation, a copy of which must be provided to the Department not less than 6 months prior to the start of a closure period or such shorter period as the Department may specify.
- (4) Without limiting sub-paragraph (2), before a race commences, the organiser must ensure that each marshal appointed under sub-paragraph (1) –
 - (a) receives appropriate training, and is competent, to discharge his or her functions;
 - (b) receives appropriate information and directions to administer and enforce this Authorisation;
 - (c) is clearly identifiable as a marshal; and
 - (d) is given an identity card as evidence of the marshal's authority.
- (5) Any training, information or directions given to a marshal under sub-paragraph (4) must include –
 - (a) incident management procedures;
 - (b) procedures relevant to opening and closing the race area; and

- (c) details relating to, and procedures to manage, prohibited and restricted areas that may be relevant to their location.

13 Cancellation and suspension etc

- (1) If the Clerk of the Course, in his or her capacity as the agent of the organiser, is given a change notice under section 8 of the Act —
 - (a) where the notice suspends or revokes this Authorisation; or
 - (b) where the notice varies this Authorisation and the Department directs the Clerk to do so,the Clerk must stop, cancel, suspend or postpone the race specified in the notice or any part of the race.
- (2) In any case to which sub-paragraph (1) applies, the Clerk must notify the senior police officer and take such measures as the Clerk considers appropriate to inform the public of the effect of it.

14 Notification of end of a closure period

- (1) At the end of a closure period, provided that the Clerk of the Course is satisfied that it is safe to do so —
 - (a) the Clerk of the Course; or
 - (b) the senior police officer, after consulting the Clerk of the Course,must arrange for one or more motor vehicles, marked in accordance with sub-paragraph (2), to travel the race area.
- (2) In relation to any part of the race area —
 - (a) subject to paragraph 15(6) having been complied with;
 - (b) unless, in the event of an incident, there has been a formal handover of the race area or a part of it from the Clerk of the Course to the senior police officer,a closure period will be treated as completed for the purposes of this Authorisation when an official motor vehicle, displaying in a prominent position, a notice with the words “Roads Open”, has passed along that part of the race area.
- (3) Any official motor vehicle referred to in this paragraph, displaying the words “Roads Open” must not exceed the speed specified in paragraph 11.

15 Erection and removal of signage

- (1) The organiser must ensure that it has sufficient signage in order to be able to comply with this Authorisation and provide a copy of its plans regarding signage to the Department not less than 6 months prior to the

start of a closure period or such shorter period as the Department may specify.

- (2) The Clerk of the Course must ensure that signage is erected and maintained immediately before, or as soon as possible after, the beginning of every closure period, and in any event before the relevant part of the race area is used for a race.
- (3) The Clerk of the Course must ensure that the signage referred to in sub-paragraphs (1) and (2) –
 - (a) is erected and maintained in accordance with the plans provided to the Department under sub-paragraph (1); and
 - (b) is clearly visible to approaching traffic.
- (4) The Clerk of the Course must ensure that, as far as reasonably practicable, the extent of any part of the race area to which access by any person, animal or vehicle is prohibited by virtue of paragraph 5 is clearly marked and indicated by signage.
- (5) The signage referred to in this paragraph must –
 - (a) be approved by the Department; and
 - (b) if the Department so directs for any particular location, include a banner stating “Road Closed” in red letters on a white background, and suspended from a tape, rope or structure.
- (6) The Clerk of the Course must ensure –
 - (a) that any signage referred to in this paragraph; and
 - (b) any Departmental traffic regulation signage ordinarily displayed on the race area or otherwise which the organiser may cover, remove or alter,

is removed or reinstated (as the case may be) at the end of every closure period.

16 Supplemental provisions

- (1) The organiser makes the following consequential, incidental or supplemental arrangements which are necessary and appropriate for the proper conduct of the race –
 - (a) parking is prohibited on the roads that form the Port Erin stages 7 and 8 as specified in column 1 of the table in Schedule 1 from one hour prior to the corresponding closure period specified in column 2 of that table until the closure period takes effect;
 - (b) a temporary speed limit of 30mph is imposed on the A17 West Kimmerragh Road from its junction with Thurrot Cottage Road for a distance of 300 metres in both directions (a total distance of 600 metres) from 6.00 a.m. on Wednesday 6 May 2026 to 6.00 p.m. on Sunday 10 May 2026.

- (2) Sub-paragraph (1) shall not apply to emergency service vehicles, public works vehicles and any vehicle authorised by the Clerk of the Course or organiser.

17 Suspension of other enactments

- (1) Where the Authorisation makes provision for any matter that is contrary to a provision of –
 - (a) the Road Traffic Act 1985;
 - (b) the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985;
 - (c) the Highways Act 1986; or
 - (d) the Licensing and Registration of Vehicles Act 1985,the relevant provision of the legislation is suspended and the relevant provision of the Authorisation has effect.
- (2) The requirements relating to tyres set out in the Road Vehicles (Maintenance and Use) Regulations 2012¹ do not apply to –
 - (a) a competing vehicle; or
 - (b) with the consent of the Clerk of the Course or the organiser, a motor car being driven by an event official in the course of his or her duty, during the period specified in sub-paragraph (4).
- (3) The requirements relating to coloured lights on vehicles specified in the Road Vehicles Lighting Regulations 2014² are suspended in relation to a motor vehicle being driven by a person authorised by the organiser during the period specified in sub-paragraph (4).
- (4) The period referred to in sub-paragraphs (2) and (3) is from 6.00 am on Wednesday 6 May 2026 to 11.59 pm on Sunday 10 May 2026.

18 Insurance and indemnity

- (1) The organiser must ensure that there is in place and maintain insurance and indemnity against death, injury or damage to persons or damage to property arising out of the conduct of any race carried on under this Authorisation and any incidental arrangements of at least one hundred million pounds (£100,000,000).
- (2) This Authorisation is of no effect unless such security or insurance and indemnity is in place before any racing begins and is maintained throughout the period from and including the first date referred to in Schedule 1 to and including the last date referred to in that Schedule.
- (3) The organiser indemnifies the Department from and against any and all claims, liabilities, losses, damages, costs and expenses (including any

finer, legal expenses on an indemnity basis, expert witness fees, expenses and costs of settlement) arising out of or in connection with any matter for which this Authorisation provides other than any matter for which the Department is responsible.

19 Revocation

If the organiser or the Clerk of the Course fails to comply with the obligations imposed upon them by or under this racing authorisation, the Department may revoke the racing authorisation.

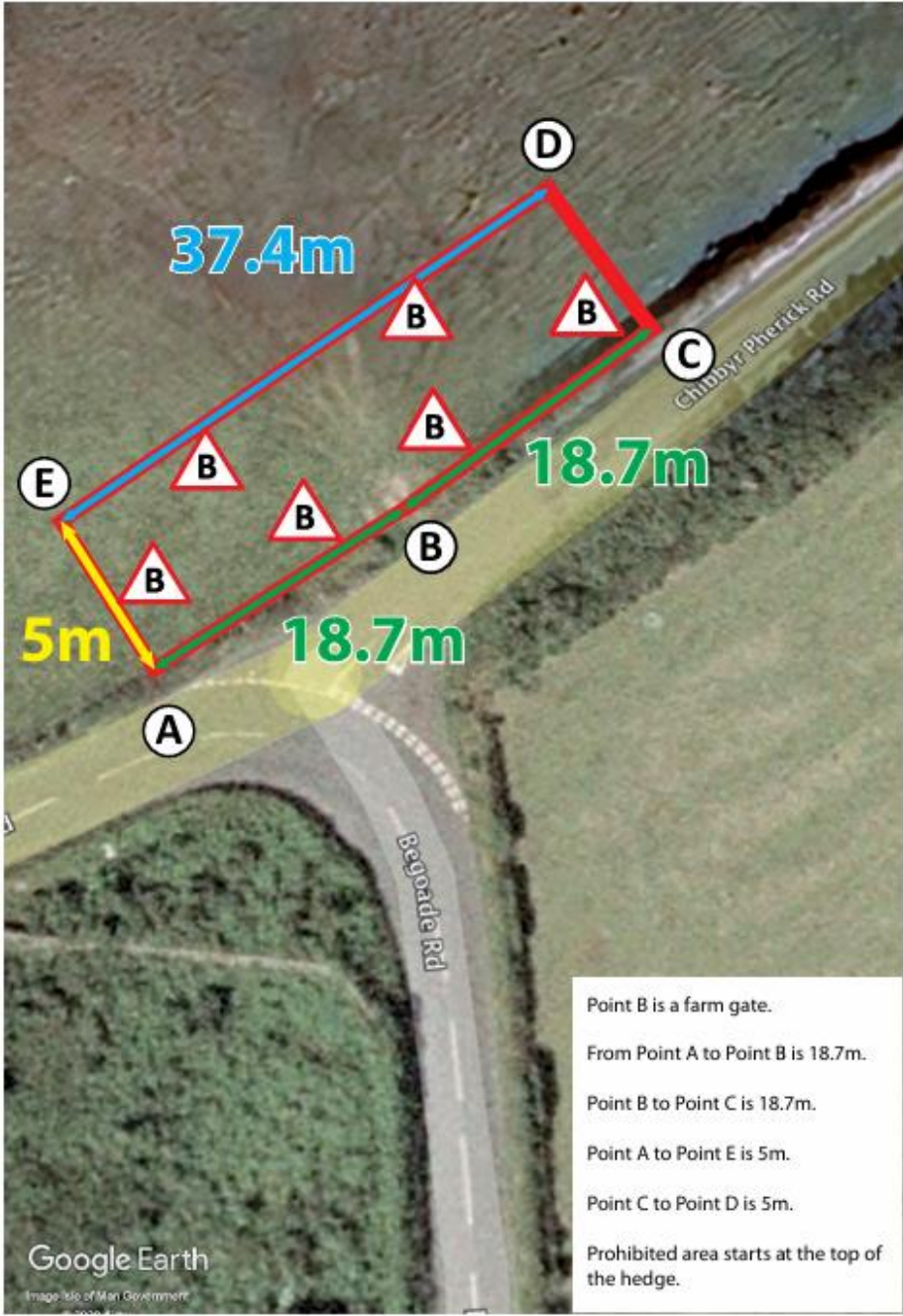

PROHIBITED AREAS - at Brandywell Cottage

A - The parcel of land that encompasses Brandywell Cottage from the point of the cattle grid sign alongside the wall that bounds the property up to the garage doors and following the established fencing to its intersection of the B10 Beinn Pott Road with its junction with the C37 Druidale Road to include the area to the front of Brandywell cottage.

B - The parcel of land to the northeast of the intersection of the B10 Beinn Pott Road with the C37 Druidale Road for a distance of 25 metres and depth of 10 metres, and the B10 Beinn Pott Road from its intersection with the C37 Druidale Road for a distance of 25 metres and depth of 10 metres.

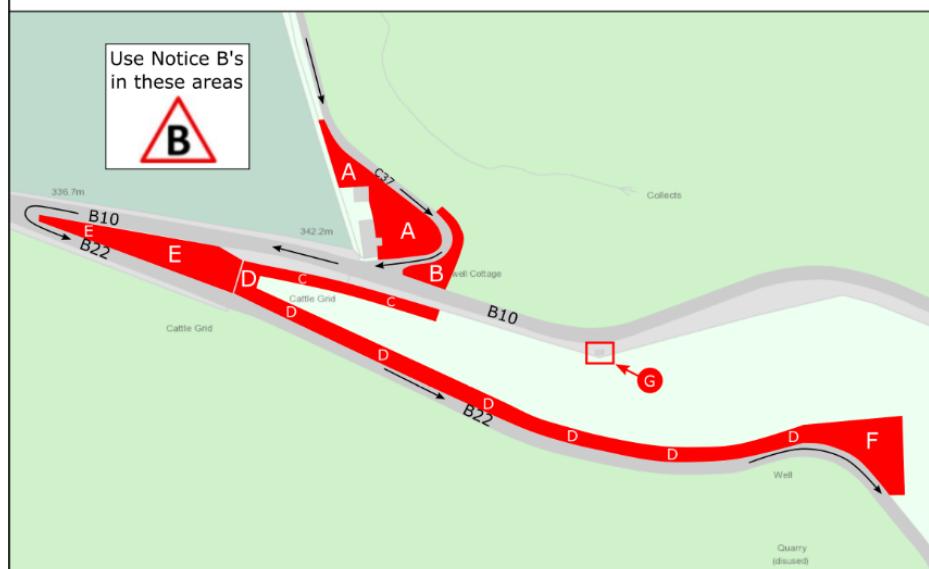
C - Section of land on the same side of the road as the concrete water tank on the B10 Beinn Pott Road (approximately 100 metres from the property known as Brandywell Cottage) from the cattle grid towards the water tank and the fence line for approx. 55 metres. The prohibited area will extend from the edge of the carriageway to a depth 3 metres behind the fence line, and beyond the cattle grid at Brandywell Cottage until it meets the link road.

D - The section of land from the link road that separates the B10 and B22 up to the fenced area at the B22 cattle grid and the section of land from the B22 at the cattle grid for a length of 240 metres to a depth of five metres from the road edge abutting said land where it joins onto section F.

E - The triangular section of land including the link road that joins the B10 and B22 upto the fence adjoining Section D.

F - Continuing on from Area D for approx. 60metres around the corner for a depth of 5 metres from the roadside and squared off in the northeast corner to a depth of approx. 20m.

G - Create red/white tape box around structure with a 1metre gap between structure and tape.
